The unique Hampstead branch of Lloyds Bank on Rosslyn Hill closed its doors for good in August 2019. Leaving for the last time I photographed the interior with the famous black horse emblem, and whilst walking home mused on the fact that, in all probability, I owe my life to Lloyds Bank.



My father, Alfred Scott-Matthews, was born on the Island of Guernsey in 1893. His father was a classical organist and composer, his mother a cellist and his sister a pianist and violin player. He went to the Elizabeth College and on leaving it was
